

April 26, 2020 Called Session Meeting

Session met to discuss accepting a PPP Loan. An application for a PPP loan was approved. After thoughtful discussion of the pros and cons, Session voted not to accept the loan because "there were others more in need of these funds."

May Session Highlights

Session met on May 9th to review and discuss the Mission Study Team's preliminary summary. Members concurred with the general direction of findings and goals.

Session met on May 17th.

Canoeing the Mountains—Completed the reading and discussion of this book.

<u>COVID 19 Planning</u>—Appointed a COVID-19 Task Force to coordinate planning efforts: Chris Nejdl, Chair, Ray Thuma, Mark Bundick, and Cindy Carlisle.

<u>Board of Deacons Report</u>—Approved expanding the use of the Deacon Fund at the discretion of the Deacons. Heard that Katherine Greenlee will offer a Guided Meditation via ZOOM to interested members of the congregation.

Nominating Committee—Heard that Cary Cook has joined the Mission Commission.

<u>Building and Grounds</u>—Heard that several repairs completed (grouting on bathroom counter tops, antenna installed on electronic sign to allow control from inside church in progress, cleaning of kitchen floors and grease traps).

<u>Finance Commission</u>— Heard reminder that FPCW has a structural budget problem that must be addressed. A task force to address increasing church revenues was suggested.

Mission Commission—Approved motion to give \$1500 from McCullough Distribution Fund to WACM in lieu of revenue from rummage sale. Approved Highway Clean Up on July 25, 2020 observing appropriate social distancing.
