

Men's Bible Study — Saturdays at 7:00 a.m.

Join us via Zoom for Bible study on Saturday mornings at 7:00 a.m. where our new study series is "Some Biblical Bases of A 'Brief Statement of Faith' ". "A Brief Statement" expresses the faith of American Presbyterians in contemporary language, and it deals with contemporary challenges. Of course, "A Brief Statement" is not entirely new. Its ideas are as old as the gospel it seeks to summarize. There is probably not a line in it with which the framers of the earlier creed would now disagree. It is based on the same Bible they loved, and it honors the same

Lord. An appendix allows cross-references to the earlier confessions. And "A Brief Statement" has some special values as we face the third millennium.

Like other studies, "Some Biblical Bases of `A Brief Statement of Faith' " is intended for seven sixty-minute sessions. It makes no attempt to explore the entire meaning of "A Brief Statement" in so short a time. The overall series is intended to be a study of the Bible, and thus, this guide focuses simply on some Bible passages that illustrate some major ideas in the Statement. Actually, an appendix to "A Brief Statement" includes more than 650 citations to Scripture, supporting the statement line by line... and here it begins.



As bad news piles up—from climate crises to daily assaults on civility—how can we cope? Where, she asks, "do we start to get our world and joy and hope and our faith in life itself back . . .

with our sore feet, hearing loss, stiff fingers, poor digestion, stunned minds, broken hearts?" We begin, Lamott says, by accepting our flaws and embracing our humanity. Our discussion of this book should be enlightening, please consider joining us.



Congregational Life News

Your Congregational Life Committee has been busy looking ahead to improving weather and vaccination rates, planning for fun spring activities.

The Hospitality Team organized a Valentine's Day mailing, resulting

in 26 Valentines distributing some love to our members and friends. Thanks to the 15 youth who wrote those Valentines. Hospitality also coordinated the preparation of our Lenten Tote Bags stuffed with fun Lenten activities and devotions. Finally, Hospitality is working on having Prayer Request Cards ready for the upcoming return to inperson worship. You'll be able to write and leave prayer requests before or after worship.

The N.O.W. Dinner team, sidelined since last fall, has met and set two dinner and two brunch dates! N.O.W. dinners will return on May 12 and May 26. The first menu is still being worked out but will likely feature items from the grill. Something new for 2021 will be two post-worship brunches. These have been scheduled for June 13 and July 11. The Fellowship Team held its initial meeting last month. Discussion included re-opening the fire pit for small groups, possible nature hikes or bike rides as part of the Earth Care initiative, sporting activities (volleyball, whiffle ball, etc.) and a return of kite flying and concerts on the lawn. Weather must improve before these activities could be scheduled, but we have good ideas ready once spring really arrives.

Compassion, Peace, and Justice Committee

The CPJ met in a mini retreat this month to do some long term planning and goal setting. We developed a mission statement to help direct our committee work. That CPJ Committee mission statement is as follows: "We go in grace, challenged by Christ's calling to be a church of action, and strengthened by the Spirit to do God's work and show God's love in the world. We seek to look beyond our walls and beyond ourselves—to see Christ's image in every face, and to transform God's Kingdom. We seek to empower every member of the congregation to share in this work." At their March meeting, the Session approved and accepted this direction for the CPJ Committee.

We also determined areas of focus for the coming year and developed some guidelines and process around engaging with projects in the community. Focus areas include :

Poverty	Peacemaking

Children/youth	Healthcare
Environmental Stewardship	Ministry to the incarcerated

Each project must have an internal champion or contact person from our congregation, be aligned with our new CPJ mission statement, fit into a matrix of balance within our plan and include projects that have a multi-generational aspect of programming.

We are currently planning several initiatives and projects as we continue to develop goals for the year that will "Build Congregational Vitality" as part of being a Matthew 25 Church. We welcome anyone who would like to become more active in Compassion, Peace and Justice activities to join one or more of our teams/projects.

Happy 175th Birthday to Us!

The First Presbyterian Church of Woodstock is 175 years old! This is another in a series of articles about our rich life here in Woodstock. Let's look this month at our worship and music life.

It is evident that worship has been central to the long life of FPC, though little was mentioned in previous histories of the church. Since 2010, several approaches to providing contemporary music and worship were piloted but were not sustainable. Some would describe our current worship as blended. We have been worshipping in our fourth church home at 2018 N. Route 47 since Easter Sunday 2007

The purchase of new organs seems an indication of FPC's commitment to making a joyful song. The 1896 pump organ was replaced in 1948 with a Lyon & Healy electronic organ, a gift of members Phillip and Eleanor Masslich. In 1974, members Carolyn and Ron Huber gifted the church with a new Allen organ. Most recently, through the generosity of church members and memorial gifts, another new Allen organ was purchased in 2018.

Previously written histories of the church note a choir was formed in 1901 and laud the wonderful musicians, organists, and choir directors who shared their talents with the church. The same is true today.

For more than a decade, FPC has been blessed with several choirs and musical groups – Voices of Faith (adult choir,) JIM JAM (Joy in Music Jesus and Me children's choir), children's chimes group, and an adult bell choir.

Musically talented youth and adults in the church provide special music, and the annual Christmas cantata and jazz services are celebrated. A Hootenanny, held a few years ago, creatively combined the abilities and talents of children, youth and adults in a delightful and memorable celebration.

During COVID-19, music provided as part of virtual worship services was creatively recorded and gratefully

received. Look for more FPCW history next month!

March Session Highlights

Sue Ayers-Krause will represent FPC at the April 13 Presbytery meeting.

Session approved COVID-19 task force recommendations to:

- resume outdoor activities at the church starting April 1 with conditions, and
- resume in-person worship with outdoor services beginning April 25 with reservations and attendance limited to 50, socially distanced with masks required.
- In the event of inclement weather, the worship leaders would move indoors to record the service for live stream.

Session also approved the Compassion, Peace and Justice (CPJ) Committee's recommendations to allocate 40% of the special Pentecost offering to Children's Advocacy Center, and approved the committee's mission Statement:

CPJ Committee Mission Statement: We go in grace, challenged by Christ's calling to be a church of action, and strengthened by the Spirit to do God's work and show God's love in the world. We seek to look beyond our walls and beyond ourselves—to see Christ's image in every face, and to transform God's Kingdom. We seek to empower every member of the congregation to share in this work.

Focus areas will include poverty, hunger, homelessness, senior care, children and youth, environmental stewardship, peacemaking, immigration, structural racism, mental health, healthcare and ministry to the incarcerated. The Ministry Support Committee provided an update on the Audio-Visual Task Force. The task force will be looking to replace our outdated (and in need of repair) soundboards and computers so we can be ready for inside worship when it's safe to do so. Session approved the pastor's job description and Cindy's request for vacation April 5-11.

In other business, a request to use the fire pit on April 18 by a Boy Scout troop was approved by unanimous consent.
