On February 23rd, First Presbyterian Church of Woodstock will have been in existence for 175 years. Praise God. Although we looked at the congregation's history during the Mission Study, this is a good time to reflect again.

As this Church was being established, the Great Famine of Ireland and the Mexican-American War took place. Mormons migrated to Utah, hand washing was proposed to stop the spread of diseases, the Communist Manifesto was published and the Seneca Falls Convention was held and the California Gold Rush began. The faith community prayed and worshipped, supported and comforted its members and community through the Civil War, World Wars I & II, the Korean War, Vietnam Conflict, and even still, the Wars in Afghanistan and Iraq. The congregation experienced together women's suffrage, civil rights, recessions and a depression, and now, two pandemics. We have adjusted to monumental changes: electricity, telephones, televisions and internet; cars and trains and planes; weapons of destruction and breakthroughs in medicine. You have rejoiced together over generations of marriages and births. You have held each other through illness and death.

It is worthwhile to consider how all this history has made us what we are today. What has bound members and friends together over the years. What is Christ calling us to do now? What does the world need us to be?

Through it all, you have been faithful disciples of Christ; brothers and sisters in Christ—in whose name we gather; in whose name we minister; in whose name all the saints live.

Take time to give thanks for Christ, for his Church, for each other. By God's grace, may you hold each other for many generations to come.



FACILITIES:

- 1) Convert at least 1 pair of lights in Great Hall with LED bulbs.
- 2) Establish a battery recycling drop-off program at the church.
- 3) Use of some locally sourced food for at least two meals.
- 4) Explore garden options.

OUTREACH:

- 1) Host at least one church-wide nature walk.
- 2) Encourage earth care habits monthly in newsletter/announcements/minute for mission at least nine times.

Session reviewed and approved these goals at the January 17 meeting. The application process and the approved goals were presented by the confirmands at the January 24 annual meeting. This is just the first of, hopefully, many years of helping the congregation be better stewards of the earth.

OUR GENEROSITY: REPORT FROM THE FINANCE TEAM

We are blessed with a strong Finance Team. I want to thank all who served in 2020: Cary Cook - Treasurer, Dave Davis – Financial Secretary, Mark Bundick, and Scott Greenlee, and Pastor Cindy – Ex Officio, and Bob Clark – Team Lead. God bless the Team for watching over your church's finances this past year.

2020 was certainly an unusual year as we navigated through the COVID-19 pandemic... and continue. Your Finance Team wants to let all of our congregation know how much we appreciate your honoring your pledges and the regular giving of those who might not have pledged by continuing your generosity through the pandemic. Our 2020 Giving Income was favorable to the Operating Budget – may God Bless the congregation's generosity!

We entered 2020 with a budget that needed significant additional income by transferring money from the McCullough Distribution Fund (MDF). Because of lower-than-expected expenses due to COVID-19, a reduction in staff, and the Giving income being on target, it was necessary to only use \$10,000, of the budgeted \$65,000 from the MDF, which was used to contribute to the Blackhawk Presbytery Mission Grant program.

Session approved the above 2021 Operating Budget. While we forecast negative Net Income, we are hopeful that increased giving will allow us to complete the year with a lower negative Net Income.

Income is forecasted to be about the same as 2020 Actual Income. We are especially grateful that the number of pledging units increased by six vs. 2020. We are hopeful that we will experience an increase in non-pledge giving similar to 2020. The Income includes transferring \$14,5000 from the McCullough Distribution Fund (as this fund is intended) to supplement Compassion, Peace & Justice Income that will be used for local mission projects and the Blackhawk Presbytery Mission Grant program

Staffing Expense is expected to stay flat vs. 2020. The increase in overall Expenses in the 2021 Operating Budget is due mostly to Building & Grounds (\$16,000) and Compassion, Peace & Justice (\$10,000).

For those of us over age $70 \frac{1}{2}$

Happy 175th Anniversary, First Presbyterian Church - Woodstock

First Presbyterian Church Woodstock is the oldest continuously worshipping congregation in Woodstock. Twenty -one members of what is now Ridgefield-Crystal Lake Presbyterian Church felt called to organize a sister church in Woodstock, and FPC was officially chartered Feb. 23, 1846. The assembled met in the courthouse until 1848 when they began worshipping in a wooden frame church they built on Church Street.

What we see today as our church's strengths – worship, education, fellowship, and music – took root under the leadership of the Rev. Richard Kimball Todd, the first pastor, who served from 1847 to 1865. His wife, Martha, "active and resourceful" led on several fronts as well.

Rev. Todd also was an educator. He started Todd School in 1848, serving boys and girls. Later, it became a prestigious boys school. Mrs. Todd brought her grand piano from New England. She provided the musical accompaniment for services and led the children's Sunday afternoon meetings. During their tenure, the Sunday school, Women's Missionary Society and the Ladies Aide Society were organized. The two societies continued into the 1940s, and Sunday school is as important today as if was nearly 175 years ago.
