In lieu of this goal, several people brought their Easter lilies back to the church to be planted at the entry of the building. Thanks to several of our gardeners and CPJ for making this happen.

Goal: Hold worship outdoors at least four times.

Goal: Incorporate earth care theme in Intergenerational VBS.


• Our first intergenerational "VBS" event was held in June. As part of the Earth Care message, the congregation traveled to the patio to talk about how we are to handle the earth.

CPJ committee is thrilled to report that we broke the goal thermometer on this second of four Special Offerings approved for this year. 22 generous donors contributed \$1866 against a \$1360 goal!!! Thank you to all who contributed. 40% of this is retained locally and will be given to the Child Advocacy Center for McHenry County to aid them in serving child victims of sexual abuse. 60% goes to PCUSA to support programs serving children and youth.

News from the Compassion, Peace and Justice Committee

You may be aware that in concert with recommendations from our Church Mission Study completed this year as part of the Pastoral Search process, the former "Mission Commission" has been renamed and restructured. We now call it the Compassion, Peace and Justice Committee or CPJ.

The committee has established a committee purpose statement which reads as follows: "We go in grace, challenged by Christ's calling to be a church of action, and strengthened by the Spirit to do God's work and show God's love in the world. We seek to look beyond our walls and beyond ourselves – to see Christ's image in every face, and to transform God's kingdom. We seek to empower every member of the congregation to share in this work."

See that last bolded part?! **Our goal is to have 100% participation of our congregation in mission activities.** We know that we all have time, talents and/or treasures to contribute to these efforts. 18 donors supported the One Great Hour of Sharing special offering and 22 donors supported the Pentecost Special Offering. That is less than half of our members. When we hold a highway or church grounds clean up day we have a handful of people who show up to help. We are issuing a call for renewed participation in mission work to all of you!

We also know that many, if not most of us, are supportive of mission work outside the auspices of the church. CPJ would like to conduct a survey to learn where and how our congregation members are serving the community in these ways. Look for that survey in a month or two (currently "under construction!") CPJ is always looking for ways to expand our church mission impact in the community and would welcome your ideas about how we can help support more compassion, peace and justice in our world!

Despite the exhortation to be involved and to BE the church, thank you for your faithful support of the mission work of our church to date. We just know that there is always more that can be done and we will strive to do this work and encourage you to do so as well.

June Session Highlights

Session business was light in June, and the meeting finished in under an hour. Likely that is a record of some sort!

Ministry Support submitted and session approved a series of recommendations including:

- The formal dissolution of our pastoral relationship with Rev. Cindy;
- A Covenant of Closure between FPC and Cindy outlining our post-ministry relationship and responsibilities;
- Approval of the annual Health Reimbursement Arrangement Plan required by Blackhawk Presbytery and the IRS, and;
- Approve facility use request for a gathering in memory of Jane Dahm on the afternoon of August 1.

Ministry Support also reported that Vanguard Service will begin cleaning the church starting August 23.

Session received Pastor Cindy's report. She has provided Mark Bundick with information about key files and documents locations. On June 17, Cindy officiated a memorial service for Ron Knaack. The family provided a \$150 donation to church; a motion to place this donation into undesignated memorial funds was approved.

The Clerk's report provided a summary of communication from the disbanded PNC regarding specific dates and financial arrangements in Pastor Corbin's terms of call and the use and remaining balance in the PNC Search Fund. Mark also read a message from Eric suggesting ideas about how to learn more about the people of FPC. Congregational Life Committee was asked to facilitate these plans.

In Other Business, a motion was approved to allow meetings in the building without masks if all participants are fully vaccinated. Masks will no longer be required for outdoor gatherings.
