

He said he feels called at this time to serve as a solo pastor of a congregation that is poised to grow in faith and service. Currently, he is serving as associate pastor of a larger Presbyterian church.

He is a Presbyterian through and through and is the grandson, son, and cousin of ordained ministers. Before responding to God's call to the ministry, he worked in various areas of technology. He enjoys what he calls "working to enhance ministry through judicious use of technology."

About his two-day visit to Woodstock and our church in late April, he said, "I love the spirit of community I experienced. You seem to know each other well. I sense church for you isn't something you go to. It's who you are." (continued, next page)

Our Mission and Service—Part Two

In 2014, FPC purchased a trailer and equipped it with tools needed for the "fix it" ministries. It's ready to go again when God calls new leadership.

The middle school youth group started packing Operation Christmas Child boxes in 1999. OCC grew into a much-anticipated all-church and community effort that continued through 2019. Tens of thousands of items and gifts were purchased and packed into 13,334 OCC boxes for children in other parts of the world. In years past, an Alternative Gifts Fair was hosted in December at which items could be purchased to support Heifer International and fair trade acquired in partnership with the Just Goods fair trade store in Rockford.

Outreach and service to the people of Woodstock the last several years have been offered through hosting Touch-A-Truck events (1,000 and 2,000 visitors over the past two years), African Children's Choir, movie nights, a magic show and a Financial University series.

In mid 2018, a friendship developed between FPC and House of Blessing (Casa de Benedicion), a local worshiping community. House of Blessing met at 2018 N. Route 47 on Sunday afternoons, and our two congregations have joined for Christmas and Easter worship, for World Community Sunday, N.O.W. dinners and some of the communitywide events mentioned above.

May Session Highlights

- Session approved arrangements for the May 15 Marty Sobczak service.
- Ministry Support's recommendation to extend Ben Thuma's contract to clean the church through August was approved.
- A contract with SASS IT to transition the church computer system to a cloud-based Microsoft Exchange platform with the cost to be added to the operating budget was approved.
- Session members discussed Rev. Dr. Kathryn Threadgill's video presentation on "Building Congregational Vitality" and what that means. Sue Krause read ratings and comments from a Compassion, Peace and Justice Committee exercise which were intended to give CPJ direction on the 7 Marks of a Vital Congregation. She will send that summary to Session members for further consideration. Session generally agreed with CPJ that we, as a congregation, are better at "inside" focused actions than we are at "outside" focused actions, and this is something we need to change to achieve better balance. An effort to "re-do" a Spiritual Gifts assessment for congregation members will begin sometime later this year.
- Education and Spiritual Growth will run Vacation Bible School as an intergenerational activity the first Sunday of June, July and August.
 Services will be shortened to allow an intergenerational activity to follow immediately after worship.

COVID Re-entry Plan - Reopening Our Church

On May 16th, the Session approved the COVID-19 Task Force recommendations for easing restrictions due to the Pandemic. Holding gatherings outdoors or virtually continue to be encouraged.

The church will now be open for indoor meetings with masks and social distancing observed. No eating or drinking indoors is permitted at this time. (Session has made an exception to this for the June 5 "Meet and Greet".) Groups of up to 15 persons will meet in classrooms 1-3, or 4-5; groups larger than 15 should meet in the Great Hall. (Common Grounds, Fireside and offices are not to be used for meetings as their size does not allow social distancing.)

Indoor gatherings should be scheduled by contacting the Clerk of Session, Mark Bundick at mbundick@comcast.net or 224-242-2451. Group guidelines will be shared at the time of scheduling.

Worshipping outdoors continues to be safest, especially for the younger people in our congregation who have not had the opportunity to be fully vaccinated. Whenever possible, worship will be held outdoors. We will continue to wear masks, with family groups distanced. Congregational singing will be allowed outdoors. In the case of inclement weather, worship will be held indoors in the Great Hall. Registration for worship is still requested to assist in developing a contact list. All services will be live-streamed or recorded and posted for public view.

A/V System Upgrade Project

The A/V Task Force was formed in January and quickly determined its primary goal was to improve the sound in the Great Hall. We contracted with local company, B&B Productions, to purchase, install and be trained on a new digital sound mixer. So far, everything is working great!

Knowing that we live in a digital world, the task force also set out to improve the live-stream of our worship service. This work is ongoing, and we will continue to meet and work on other aspects of improving audio/visual aspects throughout our church.

JUNE REPORT FROM THE MINISTRY SUPPORT TEAM

The Ministry Support Committee and Teams are in the process establishing or updating policies for Staff and Finance. We are also in the process of recommending members of the congregation for a Landscaping Advisory Group as well as a Decorating Advisory Group for our grounds and buildings.

The Audio/Visual Task Force, which is being coordinated by Christy Johanson, has made significant progress on our technology inside the building. We have experienced some Internet service issues and are in the process of addressing those to deliver a joyful experience for our live streaming and Facebook and YouTube broadcasts. The task force will also be addressing the audio quality for our outdoors services.

We are in the process of improving the church's technology and communications systems via upgraded software. We are working with the Congregational Life on improving communication systems, both internal and external to the congregation by utilizing the new technology.


