Confirmation Class



Confirmation is starting. Youth in eighth grade, along with high school students who haven't been confirmed are invited to join us in the process that leads to church membership.

The curriculum we are using this year is Big God, Big Questions, which focuses on the four questions of membership.

- Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?
- Who is your Lord and Savior?
- Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his word and showing his love?
- Will you devote yourself to the church's teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers?

Confirmands will be looking at the membership questions and how they can answer them faithfully.

Each confirmand will be paired with an adult member of the church who will mentor them through the confirmation process. If you are interested in mentoring a confirmand, please contact Ray Thuma or Pastor Eric Corbin.

We plan on meeting twice a month on Wednesdays from 6 to 7 p.m., following the NOW meal, from October through April. Confirmation Sunday will be in early May. The proposed schedule of meetings is October 6 & 20, November 3 & 17, January 5 & 19, February 2 & 16, March 2 & 16, and April 6 & 20.

Letters have been sent to the parents of likely confirmands, but if you didn't receive a letter and have a youth who is interested in joining this year's confirmation class, please feel welcome to contact [Pastor Corbin](#).

Prayground Open—Our intergenerational activity tables are open in the back of the great hall. Coloring pages, youth bulletins, and other activities will be available each week for children and anyone who likes to keep their hands busy while they listen to the message. Feel free to stop by the Prayground at any time during the Sunday worship service.

Sunday School—In addition to our "Prayground" and intergenerational activities during worship, we will be conducting a traditional Sunday School program twice a month. Jackie Lawler and Erin Kaye have volunteered to teach a short Sunday School lesson on the second and fourth Sunday of each month.

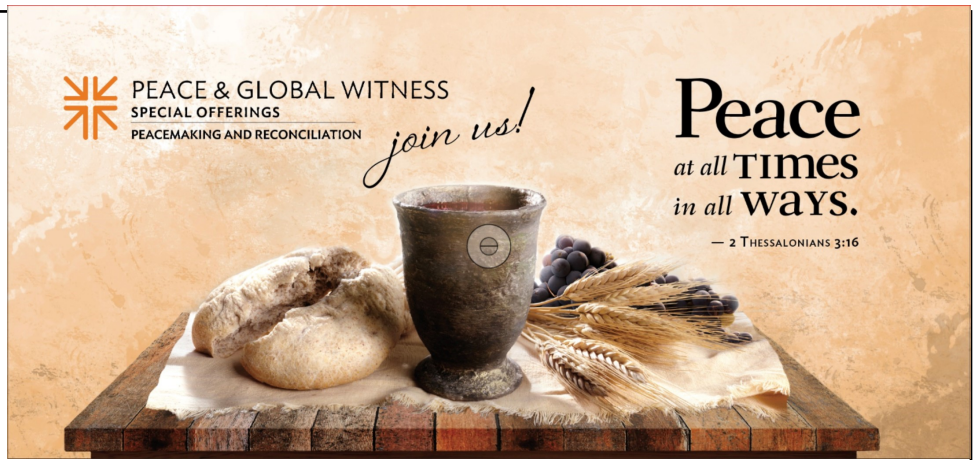
Children from pre-K through fifth grade can choose to join the Sunday School class during worship after the time with children.

Clerk's Report: A report of the September meeting of Blackhawk was received.

Pastor's Report: Eric reported a full and active inventory of his ministry including worship, pastoral care, multiple committee

meetings, engagement with the Presbytery and ecumenical groups.

Deacons' Report: Deacons are hard at work on a new pictorial member directory.

COVID Task Force: Session decided to leave food preparation with the N.O.W. team preparing and serving while masked and gloved.

Ministry Support Team: Building and Grounds will investigate responsibility for the drain located at the Route 47 northbound entrance; it's unclear whether the hole there is the responsibility of the church or IDOT. Personnel is reviewing a candidate for the open accompanist position. Committees should expect guidance from Finance for the 2022 budget in October.

Worship, Music and Arts: Worship will continue to be masked. The Activity Tables at the rear of the sanctuary have been well received.

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The committee is seeking suggestions for local groups to receive 25% of the denomination's Peace and Global Witness offering.

Education and Spiritual Growth: The committee reported on preparations for confirmation class; classes will be held twice a month immediately after N.O.W. dinners. The Presbyterian Youth Triennium will be in Indianapolis in 2022; planning will begin for our participation there. Books are being considered for a fall book study.

Congregational Life: Session provided feedback on proposed Advent Bags.

Other Business: Jim Wormley is organizing the fall stewardship effort
