To Sing or Not To Sing (Christmas Music, that is)

It is now the month of December. Thanksgiving Day has come and gone. The stores have all decked the halls with boughs of holly. The Great Hall is fully decorated, including with our new Chrismons (thanks so much for participating in that fun service!) Radio stations are playing Christmas music 24/7. It's the Most Wonderful Time of the Year! It is, until some curmudgeonly pastor like me comes along and says "Slow down. It's not Christmas yet. Stop the Christmas Carols and sing only Advent hymns in a minor key." I used to be fully in that camp. Thankfully, I've become less curmudgeonly about

Advent vs. Christmas over the course of my ministry.

However, I do still believe that we need to spend time in Advent preparing for the coming King. What does it mean that "a child is born to us, a son is given to us" (Isaiah 9:6)? What is in our lives that needs to be set aside to make room for the Christ child to be born in us anew? How can we give the gift of presence to one another, even in a global pandemic?

These questions (and others) deserve our attention during Advent, and singing "O Come, O Come, Emmanuel" in E minor is part of our preparation. However, singing "Joy to the World" (in D major!) might do us all some good in these days that are feeling dreary. So, we'll sing -- especially on December 12th, when our Intergenerational Choir will bring us the Christmas Cantata (talk about Joy -- the songs for the cantata include "Joy Comes in the Morning," "Joy in My Heart," "Good News, Great Joy," and "How Great Our Joy!") The choir will be joined by "Winds Off the Lake" and some other special guests, and our children will be presenting their program. It will indeed be a joyous day of worship together --- invite your friends and neighbors!

We'll gather for worship each Sunday, light more and more Advent candles, and prepare for the coming of Jesus, the light that "shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5) As our Advent candles remind us, this is the season of Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy -- so let's share that with everyone we meet!

I've had the opportunity to sit down with a few of you to get to know you better. I'd love to have time with more of you, so grab a time to get together with me at fpcwoodstock.org/meetwitheric. Christmas Joy Special Offering 2021

God has blessed the Church with incredible leadership in every time and place, but those leaders often need to be supported by their communities as well. This Offering addresses the support needed by some of our leaders, including supporting leadership development for communities of color, and providing support for Presbyterian church workers in their time of need.

This is the fourth Special Offering collection approved by our Session for 2021. We have set a goal of \$1365 for this collection and hope to "break our goal thermometer" as we have for the first three collections.

CPJ is **never** informed of "who" donated "how much" - only of the total amount donated and the number of individual donors.

This year, your Advent bag from First Presbyterian inclued a Reverse Advent Calendar again, but with a different twist! While we encourage you to continue to donate to local Food Pantries to the extent you can, we have a new challenge to our congregation this year as part of the Reverse Advent Calendar project.

School District 200 schools all have "Kindness Closets" where students can "shop" for needed clothes, outerwear, food and other household items. These closets are available free to all children in need in the District.

Please consider purchasing new, unopened items or donating used but in likenew condition items. Once or twice a week during Advent, put something aside in a box to be donated. Bring the box to church when you come at Christmas to be taken to the District to go to the individual school Kindness Closets.

ITEMS NEEDED: Shirts, sweaters or sweat shirts, sweatpants, coats, hats, gloves, scarves. Clothing should be marked as intended for High School, Middle school or grade school aged children. Please think like a kid and buy or donate items that you are sure a child that age would wear!!!

Often household and personal hygiene items are needed as well (laundry detergent pods, dish soap, cleaning products, soap, shampoo, toothpaste, etc.) A working mom might appreciate a bottle of hand lotion!!! A working dad might appreciate a pair of slipper socks! Be creative and above all, KIND. If you had little, what would you most appreciate receiving as an unexpected gift? Remember that the kids will be carrying their items in a backpack, so shop and package items accordingly!

We discussed Advent Bags and will deliver them to flock members that are unable to pick them up at the church on Nov. 21st.


Updates on flock members were given.

November Session Notes

Clerk's Report: The Clerk was **approved** to submit the annual statistical report to the PC-USA.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Eric reviewed his list of visits, committee meetings and meetings with community groups. He reported to session about the

Diversity Sunday program being promoted by the City of Woodstock on the second Sunday of each month.

Nominating Committee: Sue Krause reported that after multiple requests, the committee is short one vacancy for elder and two vacancies for Deacons. Session will review names and provide any they think might be suitable to Sue.

COVID Task Force: One member attending worship has tested positive for COVID-19; no other family member has tested positive. Masks will continue to be required in worship. It was moved, seconded and **approved** to allow a Boy Scout troop to use the church for a private party. Scouts will be responsible for cleaning up according to our COVID protocols.

Committee Reports

Ministry Support – Personnel: The committee recommended posting for an Office Administrator position, expected to be full time, with duties including those of Financial Secretary. Session voted to **table** the recommendation until the cost of the position could be analyzed in the full 2022 budget to be reviewed at the December meeting.

Ministry Support – Finance: Session voted to **approve** a recommendation for the purchase of drums from the Undesignated Memoral Funds.

Worship, Music and Arts: The committee reported that Advent services have been planned, poinsettia orders are being received, and special music has been scheduled.

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The Global Peace and Witness offering raised \$1,483 with our 25% local share being sent to the local group "Standing Up Against Racism".

Education and Spiritual Growth: The committee recommended and session approved a January book study using "Anxious to Talk About It: Helping White Christians Talk Faithfully about Racism" by Carolyn Heisel.
