

# NEWS FROM COMPASSION, PEACE AND JUSTICE COMMITTEE

#### January, 2022

CPJ had a very busy Advent season. We held our second annual craft fair in November, the proceeds of which will support our church youth programs. We collected Reverse Advent calendar offerings to help supply the Kindness Closets at local District 200 schools and a Giving Tree to supply Christmas gifts for two Veterans' families.

During Advent, we promoted the fourth Special Offering drive, the Christmas Joy Offering. During the year, we collected three other Special Offerings, each with a goal of \$1365. In all of the first three, we raised more than the goal, the highest total being about \$1495, from 13-18 contributors. The Christmas Joy offering raised \$1970 from 26 contributors!!!! WOW!

Our goals for next year are slightly higher - \$1400 for each offering, but our primary goal is to have all members contribute to these to the extent they are able. No amount is too small!!! As we did this year, we will provide information from PCUSA about the purpose of each special offering as these come up. Meanwhile, THANK YOU for your generosity and support of these Offerings!

During 2022, beginning in January, we will be piloting a new project in collaboration with the Woodstock Food Pantry and the McHenry County Diaper Bank. Once a month, we will distribute diapers at the church to those who need them and who have been referred by the Food Pantry. January 5 from 4:00-5:30 p.m. will be our first distribution.

This committee is a very busy group which strives to be the face of our congregation in the community. We have 7 faithful members who plan and implement all of our projects. We are always looking for new ideas and would love to have new members join our group. We meet monthly on the third Thursday at 6:00 PM via ZOOM to conduct business and plan events. #### **December Session Notes**

**Nominating Committee**: Pastor Eric and session discussed the need to fill one elder and one deacon position.

**COVID Task Force**: Suggestions from elders included follow up with ushers to leave the Great Hall doors open during service, and to follow up with Building and Grounds about what air filter options are available.

**Ministry Support–Finance**: A recommendation from committee to form a task force made up of both session and non-session members to address the structural budget issue identified in the most recent Mission Study Report was approved.

At the called meeting on December 19, session reviewed a tabled at the November 21, 2021 meeting regarding the Personnel Team's recommendation to post for an Office Administrator position, expected to be full time, with duties including those of Financial Secretary, and to review and approve an operating budget for 2022. The Personnel Team's tabled recommendation was taken from the table and approved unanimously. A motion to approve the 2022 budget with the provision that up to \$50,000 of unrestricted McCullough Distributed funds be used to help balance the budget was made and approved unanimously.

**Worship, Music and Arts**: The intergenerational Christmas Cantata was very well received. Suggestions for Worship follow-ups included instructions to ushers about taking attendance given the detailed attendance sheets being taken by Hospitality Team greeters; finalizing the protocol for returning the offering box to the entryway—members and visitors have been putting gifts into the box as they exit worship; and formalizing who will lock up the church after service. Communion dates for 2022 were approved.

**Congregational Life**: The committee requested that the freezer drain malfunction be investigated and repaired. A recommendation from committee to approve a new "valet parking" service, to be run by the Hospitality Team on Sunday mornings, pending an insurance agent discussion, was approved.

**Other Business**: Session approved calling a congregational meeting for the purpose of electing new elders and deacons on Sunday, January 9, immediately following worship. Session approved calling the annual congregational meeting for Sunday, January 30, immediately following worship.

- Contribution Income was favorable to budget partially due to receiving 2022 pledge income in November and higher than planned non-pledge contributions throughout the year.
- Balance Sheet no issues
- Cash Flow Operating cash favorable to plan by about \$22,000 mostly due to favorable contributions as stated above in the Operating Budget.
- Session approved the 2022 Operating Budget with Income unfavorable to Expenses by ~\$25,000 after subsidizing Income with \$50,000 from the McCullough Distribution Fund.
- Session has approved hiring an Office Administrator.
