



Other Business: To promote clarity about work and responsibilities, the clerk was asked to prepare a summary of committee scope and charter based on the mission study for next month's meeting.

RIP Medical Debt

Medical debt can easily become a crushing burden for anyone who faces a serious illness or injury. This can lead to negative credit reports which make it harder to rent an apartment or buy a car and is a leading cause of bankruptcy. Under our presbytery's Matthew 25 initiative we have been challenged to eliminate medical debt as part of our goal of eradicating systemic poverty. Blackhawk Presbytery has a goal of eliminating \$1.5 million in medical debt.



Fortunately, we do not need to raise \$1.5 million in cash to eliminate \$1.5 million in debt. By leveraging the debt collection system rules, debt can be retired for pennies on the dollar and the presbytery only needs to raise \$15,000.

To do our part in retiring medical debt, we have started a "bandage" fund raiser. Simply write a check with RIP Medical Debt on the memo line, or place cash in an donation envelope and mark it RIP Medical Debt, and then place your donation in the regular offering box at the back of the great hall. You can also donate online. After you make a donation take one of the bandages, color it any way you like and tape it to the glass at the back of the great hall.




Worship Arts News
