
## Join Us for the Fall N.O.W. Dinners!



#### **McCollough Endowment Investment Summary**

- The Portfolio ended 3Q22 at \$854,167 vs. previous quarter end value of \$899,183 and withdrawals of \$9,262.75
- Global equity markets had a negative third quarter. When the final Wall Street bell tolled on September 30th, all major equity markets were red. Further, entering Q4 2022, the DJIA and S&P 500 are both at their lowest since November 2020, while NASDAQ is at its lowest since the end of July 2020.
- For the third quarter of 2022: The DJIA dropped 6.7%; The S&P 500 lost 5.3%; NASDAQ lost 4.1%; and the Russell 2000 declined 3.6%.
- As the Fed increased interest rates during the quarter, to fight inflation, bond prices declined. The average intermediate bond fund dropped -4.64%.
- Due to the market value Session decided to suspend the quarterly distributions as September Balance Sheet shows ~\$150,000 Undesignated from the previous quarterly distributions.

#### **October Session Notes**

**Nominating Committee:** Kristen Matter has agreed to be nominated for Deacons. Tentative date for a congregational meeting to elect her is November 6.

**Compassion, Peace and Justice:** The committee is seeking a Spanish speaker for diaper distribution. Katherine Greenlee assisted at the last distribution and was a big help.

**Congregational Life:** The photo directory needs updating; Deacons lead this project last year, but Congregation Life could help if needed, possibly by scheduling an event in conjunction with picture taking.

**Education and Spiritual Growth:** The committee is searching for a Go and Serve trip in 2023. Eric is working on a book study for Advent. The committee is working with Building and Grounds to finalize a location for the library.

**Ministry Support – Personnel:** Dawn has prepared a draft of Eric's annual review and gave access to all session members; Session will need to put together an action plan for 2023. This may be done as part of a separate meeting or retreat to talk about the future of church.

Worship, Music and Arts: Sanctuary decorating for Advent with pizza supplied by Hospitality will take place on November 20 after worship. There will be a December 11 cantata with Winds off Lake plus Sunday School participation. The task force working on Great Hall enhancements has purchased two banners to be hung next to the monitors. They are multicolored to fit with any liturgical color, and were funded from the Chancel fund. Worship will work with B&G to get these hung.

#### **Other Business:**

Facility Use Agreement: Eric led a discussion of the current agreement for building use. The requirements, including additional insured coverage of \$1,000,000 might knock out some groups. Bob will discuss needs with our insurance agent, who might be able to provide such coverage for a nominal sum. A motion to approve building use without charge or insurance for the upcoming Maples piano concert was made, seconded and approved.
