What DOES Christmas Mean?

I love the classic Dr. Seuss book *How the Grinch Stole Christmas!* The Grinch hated Christmas, while the Whos who lived in Whoville loved it. The Grinch thinks that he can stop Christmas from coming by stealing the Whos' presents and food, and so he tries just that. However, he soon finds out that he hadn't stopped Christmas, after all, as the Whos awoke and sang their joyful song, nonetheless. The Grinch realizes that Christmas "came without ribbons! It came without tags! It came without packages, boxes, or bags!" He can't figure out how, but eventually he realizes something big: "Maybe Christmas,' he thought, 'doesn't come from a store. Maybe Christmas, perhaps, means a little bit more!"

Now, I'm not suggesting that we all celebrate Christmas without any gift-giving. This Christmas, my family will gather around our tree and delight in the giving and receiving of gifts. However, I am hoping that all of us will spend time pondering the fact that Christmas "doesn't come from a store" and that it does "means a little bit more" – in fact, a lot more! At Christmas, we celebrate the miracle of the Incarnation – that Almighty God came to Earth in human form, as a baby born in a lowly manger. Or, as The Message paraphrase puts it, "The Word became flesh and blood, and moved into the neighborhood." That "good news of great joy" has perhaps become old news to us. We know the Christmas story by heart, and so we might not deeply consider what it means for us, today. I hope you'll join in worship services during Advent and Christmas as we ponder those matters.

Also, while we sing about this being "the most wonderful time of the year," we know that's not necessarily the case for everyone. We'll hold space for each other, just as we are, knowing that God is present with us in our joy and in our sorrow.

Christmas Joy Offering

Advent is the time of year when we collect the fourth of the four special offerings collected by the Presbyterian Church (USA). This offering is split equally between the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions and Presbyterian-related schools and colleges equipping communities of color. The Assistance Program provides critical financial support to church workers and their families. Presbyterian-related schools and colleges provide education and leadership development while nurturing racial and ethnic heritage.

When considering giving to this special offering, please think about the many stories of ways this offering has helped. For example, PC(USA) shares this:

As a lifelong advocate of the connectional nature of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.), the Rev. Ben Franklin Whitfield never expected that this denominational doctrine would one day prove indispensable to him at his own time of greatest need. Ben, honorably retired since 2007 in the Presbytery of Wabash Valley, suffered a stroke in January 2021. After a hospital stay followed by a period of rehabilitation, he was released into the care of his loving wife, Helen, and allowed to return home.

Facing financial hardships after a lifetime in ministry serving primarily rural congregations with limited budgets, the Whitfields received support from the Assistance Program of the Board of Pensions, part of our Presbyterian connectional system. The Assistance Program provides need-based grants to help active and retired plan members and their families in times of financial crisis. The Whitfields received immediate help from an Emergency Assistance grant and long-term help from a monthly Housing Supplement for Retirees receiving Home Health Care.

The support the Whitfields receive is made possible, in part, by the Christmas Joy Offering, a Presbyterian tradition since the 1930s. Our overall goal for this offering is \$1400, but more importantly, our goal is to encourage everyone to participate in some way no matter how small. November Session Notes

Clerk's Report: Mark Bundick provided session with a preliminary review of the membership roll for the annual membership review.

Nominating Committee: Given the treasurer's desire to step down at the end of 2023, the committee is seeking an assistant treasurer to begin to transition the treasurer duties to someone new.

COVID Task Force: Chris and Ray will be stepping down at the end of the year and will need replacement.

Committee Reports:

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The Peace and Global Witness offering met its \$1,400 goal. Sarah Michehl of the Land Conservancy will speak on pollinator gardens after the March 22 N.O.W. dinner.

Congregational Life: The Education and Spiritual Growth committee confirmed Sunday School will continue on the 2nd and 4th Sundays (generally); N.O.W. will work to schedule brunch on those dates when it meets on December 4.

Education and Spiritual Growth: The Youth Group will bake cookies for shut ins on December 10. The committee is investigating Go and Serve trips organized by Group Mission Trips. A committee recommendation to sponsor the Boy Scout troop that Ray Thuma volunteers with was approved.

Ministry Support : Building and Grounds: Session needs to keep in mind that our building will be 20 years old only four years from now, and thus we face some major expenses for systems that are reaching end of life: fire pump replacement, full paint job for the Great Hall, carpeting, rooftop AC units, and parking lot replacement.

Worship, Music and Arts: Advent preparations continue to go well. The committee budgeted to continue with packaged communion elements given the uncertainties around COVID, the flu and RSV. Accessibility needs for those with visual impairments was discussed, but no decisions about how to accommodate these needs has yet been made. Recommended communion dates for 2023, January I, February 5, March 5. April 2, April 6, (Maundy Thursday), May 7, June 4, July 2, August 6, September 3, October I (World Communion Sunday), November 5, and December 3, were approved.

Next Regular Meeting: Tuesday, December 13, 2022 at 6:00 p.m., jointly with the Deacons.
