### More winter?

As I write this (a bit late), Woodstock Willie has prognosticated. Six more weeks of winter, according to our favorite groundhog. As we continue to gather in the cold and wintry conditions, my thanks go out to Chris Dahm for keeping our parking lot cleared for activities at the church, as well as to the list of volunteers who take care of the sidewalk and entryway! Around our house, when someone mentions the cold, one of us very often will quote Elsa from the Disney movie *Frozen* when she says “the cold never bothered me, anyway.” Though I am quite hot-natured, that’s not entirely true – the cold does get pretty rough. As it does, think of your friends and neighbors, particularly those who might be homebound. See if you can pick up something from the grocery store for them, or run some errands, or just phone to check on them.

Speaking of Disney movies, in *Frozen II*, one of the key songs is called “The Next Right Thing.” Anna sings about her despair in a really tough situation. She faces uncertainty, not knowing where to turn. She realizes she must carry on, and sings this: “Just do the next right thing; Take a step, step again; It is all that I can do The next right thing.”

Sometimes, that is the best advice for each of us, as we face difficult situations, or even difficult decisions. We might be looking further down the road, when we need to just do “the next right thing.” One of my mentors often pointed out that the Psalmist wrote “Your word is a *lamp* to my feet,” not a *floodlight*. A lamp to our feet gives us enough light to see the next step, rather than looking further out into the future. Sometimes, that’s all we need. Today, and each day, why don’t we just try to do “the next right thing.”

In the month of February, one of those “right things” is to commemorate Black History Month. In worship, we’ll be singing “We Shall Overcome” as our sending song each week, reminding us of that anthem of the civil rights movement and the work that still remains to be done. May we do the next right thing in areas of greater unity.

## EARTHCARE CONGREGATION NEWS FROM THE CPJ COMMITTEE

First Presbyterian Church of Woodstock received certification as an "Earth Care Congregation" (ECC) in February of 2021. Becoming an ECC required a robust application process, defining goals and embracing the Earth Care Pledge stated below:

"Peace and justice is God's plan for all creation. The earth and all creation are God's. God calls us to be careful, humble stewards of this earth, and to protect and restore it for its own sake, and for the future use and enjoyment of the human family. As God offers all people the special gift of peace through Jesus Christ, and through Christ reconciles all to God, we are called to deal justly with one another and the earth."

The Earth Care goals are spread among four areas: WORSHIP, EDUCATION, FACILITIES, and OUTREACH. One of our goals for 2023 in the area of EDUCATION is to host an Earth Care speaker. In January over \$3,000 was issued to D-200 residents through WACM's Direct Assistance Program. That assistance often helped households with past due rent and utility bills or provided gasoline vouchers to people with transportation needs. 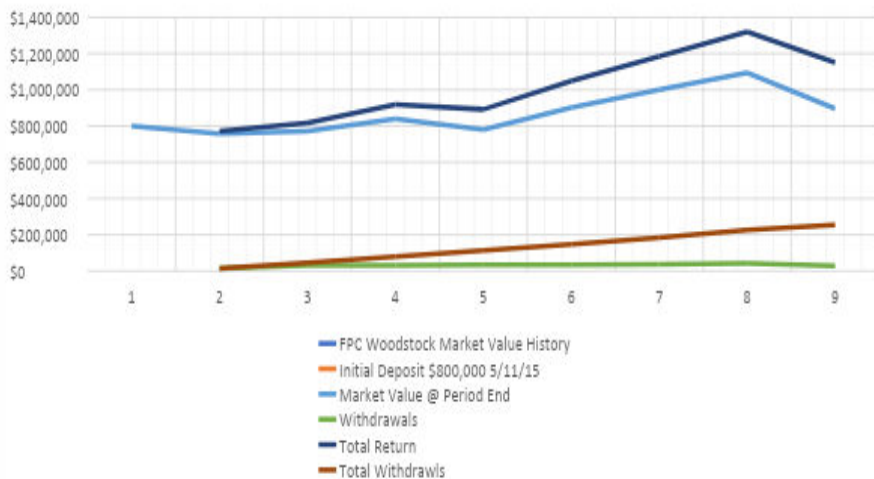
