Rise Again

When I was in high school marching band, there was an arrangement of a song called "Rise Again" which was popular with marching bands. As a trumpet player, I remember the trumpet part was pretty fun to play, and sounded really good! I'm not sure how it was that public schools came to often play this religious song, but it was there in my memories, and the words of the song came to me while thinking about this letter to you.

The verses of the song are about Jesus' crucifixion and burial. The chorus then says this:

*'Cause I'll rise again
Ain't no power on earth can tie me down
Yes, I'll rise again
Death can't keep me in the ground!*

That is the promise of Easter – death cannot keep its hold on Jesus, and therefore, on us, either. One of the great Easter hymns of the church is "Christ the Lord is Risen Today" and it includes these two great lines: "Where, O death, is now your sting?" and "Where your victory, O grave?" We celebrate the resurrection of Jesus this Easter Sunday and proclaim that death does not have the final word.

Before we get to Easter, though, we must go through the pain of Good Friday. As I write this, Palm Sunday is a few days away, where we will wave our palm branches and welcome Jesus as we commemorate the Triumphal Entry. We'll then gather on Maundy Thursday for a service of communion, followed by self-guided prayer and meditation stations. On Good Friday, we come together for a service of shadows, or Tenebrae. (*Tenebrae is a Latin word meaning "darkness."*) The services in between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday are important, meaningful ones, and I hope to see you here. Without those services, we skip from the joy of Palm Sunday to the joy of Easter Sunday and miss the depth of sacrifice of Jesus in the days that come between.

In addition to worship, I hope to see you in various meetings and times of fellowship and service. Read this newsletter to learn more about the activities of the church in the month of April. While worship is a central gathering purpose for the church, we are also called together in many ways throughout our days. *Come and see!*

UPDATE ON PROPOSED BYLAW CHANGES

We did not have a quorum of members present at the March 12, called congregational meeting. Session has called another congregational meeting after worship on Easter Sunday, April 9, to try to vote on the proposed bylaws amendments.

After feedback from members, session has also made a minor change in one of the proposed amendments. The change to Article V, Meetings of the Congregation and Corporation – Quorum from “The quorum of a meeting of the congregation shall be the moderator, the secretary, and no fewer than 25 per cent of the active members of the congregation.” to “The quorum of a meeting of the congregation shall be the moderator, the secretary, and no fewer than 20 per cent of the active members of the congregation.” Shifting to the lower percentage would require 31 members instead of 39 to make a quorum.

The other changes remain as proposed. They would change Article VII, Session, from “The Session shall be comprised of eight ruling elders elected by the congregation.” to “The Session shall be comprised of six ruling elders elected by the congregation.” And to change Article VIII, Deacons, from “The Board of Deacons shall be comprised of eight deacons elected by the congregation.” to “The Board of Deacons shall be comprised of six deacons elected by the congregation.”

Please make every effort to attend and vote on the proposed changes on April 9.

The Finance Team is off to its usual yearly start, finalizing the budget load into QuickBooks, and preparing for an intensive review of income and expense at the end of the first quarter. We'll also be looking at the performance of the McCullough Endowment after the volatile markets swings we've had. Check out our report in the May newsletter for full details.

Administratively, we've got several 2023 projects on our radar:

- Documentation of our IT infrastructure

- Partnering with another church in an independent review of our financial reporting.

Finally, below is a snapshot of income and expense vs. budget at the end of February. It's really too early for us to sort out any trends, but history tells us that these figures are typical for our budget at this time of year.

MARCH SESSION NOTES

Clerk's Report: After discussion, session voted to change a proposed by-laws amendment regarding a quorum for congregational meeting from the original proposed 15% to 20%. Session also voted to call a congregational meeting on Sunday, April 9, to consider the bylaws changes.

Committee Reports

Compassion, Peace and Justice: We have been recertified as an Earth Care Congregation.

Congregational Life: The committee will be working with Building and Grounds to put up our Welcome banner. Advertising will be shifting from the Northwest Herald to the Woodstock Independent.

Education and Spiritual Growth: The committee is working to add the Boy Scout troop info to our webpage. The committee is working to decide if more fundraisers will be needed to fully pay for the "Go and Serve" trip; the trip will start on July 30.

Ministry Support – Finance: Financial reports were accepted with thanks.

Ministry Support – Buildings and Grounds: An outdoor work day will be scheduled in the spring.

Worship, Music and Arts: A committee recommendation that \$1,000 of the worship coordinator's salary be reallocated to contract musicians' amount (making the resulting total \$2,000 per year contract musicians' budget) was approved.
