Make a Joyful Noise to the Lord

The scriptures encourage us to come before God with singing.

One of the most memorable Psalms is Psalm 98, in which we read this:

- 4 Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth; break forth into joyous song and sing praises.
- 5 Sing praises to the Lord with the lyre, with the lyre and the sound of melody.
- 6 With trumpets and the sound of the horn make a joyful noise before the King, the Lord.

At least three other Psalms repeat the refrain "Make a joyful noise:" Psalm 66, 95, and 100. Other translations have this as "Shout triumphantly to the Lord," "Shout for joy to the Lord," and "Shout out praises to the Lord." Something I note in all of these translations is that there's nothing about the necessity of being classically trained in music before making this joyful noise! We are all called to shout out our praises to the Lord. A relative of mine was once told by a very good singer that he couldn't sing well, and he then stopped singing in church. That saddens me, as I believe God wants to hear all of our voices in worship, and any of us can make a "joyful noise" or "shout triumphantly!" So, let your voice be heard in worship this, and every, Sunday!

On May 21st, we'll celebrate the gift of music in worship with a special Music Appreciation Sunday. I'm looking forward to our combined bell choir and chancel choir leading us in worship that day. It will also be a day to honor the gifts and talents of our accompanist, Roger Dickman, as that will be his last day with us. Roger is departing for opportunities closer to his home. We will greatly miss his wonderful musicianship, friendly personality, and gracious musical leadership. Please see a note from Roger elsewhere in this newsletter.

In addition to worship, I hope to see you in various meetings and times of fellowship and service. Read this newsletter to learn more about the activities of the church in the month of May. While worship is a central gathering purpose for the church, we are also called together in many ways throughout our days. Come and see!

for a hike and cookout! We are also extending the invitation to the incoming 6th graders to come get a sneak peak into the fun events we have!


Youth Group events will resume in September.

Kids Fishing Lessons at Geneva Lake Conservancy - Children's Fishing Park

With the help of our educated GLC and Lake Geneva Fishing Club staff, we will oversee the fishing lessons and help your child catch fish! Every fish caught will be released back into the waters. Two fishing poles will be given away every lesson for the two largest fish caught. Each lesson includes a coupon for Frosty Moose ice cream. Lessons are every Tuesday at 9 a.m. and 10 a.m., starting June 6th. Lessons are one hour long. Last day of lessons is August 29th. Every parent/guardian must sign a waiver at the Pier before their child's first lesson and stay on-site during the lesson. Fishing poles and life jackets will be provided as they will spend part of the time fishing from the Municipal Pier, weather permitting.

WACM NEWS

Transportation is a challenge for some Woodstock residents. Through WACM's Direct Assistance Program (DAP), drivers can get a gasoline voucher to get to and from work or medical appointments. McFare Cards, used for Dial-a- Ride, can be given to non-drivers. Assistance toward car repairs is also available. WACM's funds come from member congregations, including First Presbyterian, and fundraisers. Thank you for your support of WACM and DAP and the mission to provide financial assistance to Woodstock residents in need.









DIAPER DISTRIBUTION UPDATE

As of January 2023, the Diaper Distribution project has a new supplier: "Keeping Families Covered" (KFC). The executive director for The Diaper Bank of Northern Illinois was ready to retire and reached out to KFC to take over their operations.

Keeping Families Covered is a non-profit organization based in Waukegan serving Lake County and now expanding into McHenry County. One of the benefits of this transition is that we are now able to offer adult diapers. We are partnering with the Woodstock Food Pantry to distribute diapers on the first Wednesday of each month from 4:00 p.m.-5:30 p.m. at our church. In 2022 we distributed 4,958 diapers. At our first four distributions in 2023, we have already given away 4,291 diapers. We appreciate the help and support we've received, and it's exciting to think about how many children and families we might serve in 2023!

Finance Notes


April Finance Notes by Mark Bundick, Finance Team Lead

The Finance Team spent most of our April meeting reviewing our current balance sheet and profit and loss reports. Nothing unexpected showed up in the numbers and our budgets are trending as expected.

In reviewing the balance sheet, we did note that our total funds at Advia Credit Union exceeded the \$250,000 FDIC insurance coverage. The team has recommended to session that sufficient funds be moved to a second bank to get us back under the insured deposit limit.

APRIL SESSION NOTES

Clerks Report: Minutes of the March 19 Session and April 9 Congregational meetings were approved.

Deacon's Report:

Since the deacons are still one person short of a full slate, they have redistributed members to the flocks of the 5 current deacons. They have been kept busy with hospitalizations and illness recoveries.

Committee Reports: Compassion, Peace and Justice: The One Great Hour of Sharing offering collected over \$2,100, exceeding the \$1,500 goal.

Congregational Life: Church advertising has been shifted from the Northwest Herald to the Woodstock Independent since most of our members are from Woodstock and Wonder Lake. The committee will be helping staff our booth at the Woodstock Pride Fest.

Education and Spiritual Growth: Plans have been finalized for the youth "Go and Serve" trip this summer. Sunday School will be wrapping up on May 14. VBS will be conducted jointly with the First Methodist Church.

Ministry Support-Finance: Session approved a recommendation to move \$100,581.83 from Advia Credit Union to BMO Harris Bank in order to have all church bank accounts fully covered by FDIC insurance. The team is working with Worship to investigate improving our current Internet service; our connection has failed multiple times in the past few months.

Ministry Support-Personnel: Our soon to be open accompanist position has been advertised extensively. Please feel free to let the church office know of any potential candidates.

Worship, Music and Arts: Session approved returning communion service to passing the elements; single serving communion elements will be available to those uncomfortable with served elements. Music Sunday will be held on May 21, recognizing all those who have given their musical talents to our services over the last year, and we'll recognize Roger Dickman on his last Sunday with us.


A LETTER FROM ROGER DICKMAN
