Thanks to the congregation of First Presbyterian for their support of WACM.



July Finance Notes by Mark Bundick, Finance Team Lead

The Finance spent nearly all the time in our July meeting reviewing the mid-year financial reports.

While there is a shortfall in pledge income, this is typical of our mid-year review. We expect pledge income to meet budget by the end of the year.

On the expense side, we are running favorable variance in multiple committees. Finance recommended no adjustments to our 2023 budget at this time. While the overall budget remains in deficit, it's slightly better than forecast. Finance will be undertaking another detailed review at the end of the third quarter, just prior to starting the 2024 budget process.

Finance also reviewed our balance sheet. Currently, there is approximately \$70,000 in unallocated income from the McCullough Distribution Fund for use to cover deficits. Previously, session had discontinued taking income distributions from the McCullough Endowment due to the drop in markets and the substantial balance in the Distribution Fund. Markets have since recovered quite nicely. Given the rebound in the endowment's value, and our expectation that 2024's budget will be in deficit, Finance recommended, and session approved, resuming taking income distributions in order to boost the unallocated income available to provide budget assistance.

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The diaper distribution project continues to grow. Given Crandall's reduction in fund raising events, the committee is investigating options for a WACM fundraiser in the Great Hall.

Education and Spiritual Growth: Confirmation returns this fall with 7th and 8th graders as participants.

Ministry Support

Building and Grounds: The committee will be replacing the missing first aid kit in the Education room.

Finance: Session approved a committee recommendation to re-start the 4% distribution of income from the McCullough endowment.

Staff Management: The search for an organist continues.

Worship, Music and Arts: Rally Sunday will be on September 10; the committee will coordinate events with Education and Congregational Life. The committee is exploring the idea of honoring Rev. Paul Nelson by updating the library and naming it in his honor.

Other Business: Marla Norgard is stepping down as coordinator for Meals on Wheels and the search is underway for a replacement coordinator.
