FPC Woodstock will be collecting contributions to this Special Offering during September. Our goal is to collect \$1500 this year. The Compassion, Peace and Justice Committee will recommend to Session which local organization we want the 25% of our total collected to go to.

FINANCE NOTES

August Ministry Support Notes

While in previous months, we're reported mainly on financial matters, we have items this month from all three teams in the Ministry Support Committee.



First, from Personnel, we're still working on finding a permanent accompanist for worship. You can help in this search by letting friends and family know about our open position. The job description is on Indeed.com here: <https://tinyurl.com/3ef7bhtr>

Building and Grounds is working to obtain bids to sealcoat and re-stripe our parking lot. Additionally, they're investigating our kitchen freezer, which keeps icing up. It's not clear whether it can be repaired or whether it will need replacement. Finally, B&G and Congregational Life will be working to re-install our "Welcome!" sign for the start of the church year.

Finance conducted its normal review of our financial statements. Pledge income is swinging back in line, as we ease into the fall. We paid the \$10,000 Presbytery mission gift in July. This is the fourth year where we've been able to help the Presbytery's mission work.

For this month's financial report, we've added a line item to show the use of undesignated McCullough funds to balance our budget.

During the first week of October, committee chairs will receive a packet of information consisting of a month-by-month breakdown of expenses incurred during the first 9 months of 2023 and 3 months of remaining budget for 2023. A blank worksheet for 2024 budgeted expenses will be provided for committee chairs to complete and return by November 1. This will give Finance time to build a first draft of the 2024 budget for review in November with a final budget done by the December session meeting.

AUGUST SESSION NOTES:

Deacon's Report: Deacons are working to finalize and print the new church directory.

Memorial Committee: The plaque for the bell restoration project is being produced. When done, work will begin on the new bell support structure.

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The WACM Board has decided that a fundraising dinner won't be held in 2023.

Congregational Life: N.O.W. dinners begin September 13. The committee is brainstorming ideas for an "Inquirer's Class" for those interested in exploring membership. Target date is October 1.

Education and Spiritual Growth: Rally Day will be Sunday, September 10. Confirmation will be held this church year with 7th thru 9th graders. A fall book study is being planned.

Ministry Support – Building and Grounds: The N.O.W. team reports that the freezer is leaking and freezing up again. B&G will investigate to determine if it needs replacement.

Ministry Support – Finance: At the beginning of October, committee chairs will receive their budget packet with a November 1 target date for returning. This timing permits Finance to present a first draft at the November session meeting, with a final 2024 budget approved at the December meeting.

Other Business:

Building Use Request: A request from a non-member family living in Justice Hill to use the church for a funeral was approved.

Expanding Ministry Opportunities: Session discussed ways to involve more of the congregation in our ministries. Ideas included scheduling more events after worship, when people are already here, and providing clear descriptions of what's involved in the ministry.
