From Pastor Eric: God's Grace

A recent sermon topic was God's grace and whether it is "fair." My thinking is that it isn't "fair" for us to receive God's grace. We can't ever deserve it. We simply receive the gift of God's grace, with gratitude. After that sermon, I ran across an article by Jay Adams. Adams has a hummingbird feeder at his house, and that feeder has four openings for the birds. Yet every day, one hummingbird chases off other hummingbirds that try to get to the sugar water. Adams writes of that one hummingbird, "All day long he sits on the branch of a nearby apricot tree guarding 'his' feeder and defying others to transgress on what he has established as 'his' territory."

Adams notes that it was he who bought the feeder and he who supplies the sugar water. The hummingbirds don't earn it; they simply receive it. Yet, they fight over it. He concludes "How like the people of God! All we have or are that is worthwhile is the gift of God's pure grace. And yet we can be proud, self-centered, envious, and quarrelsome. Often, we fight over God's good gifts rather than expressing our gratitude in humility and sharing what we have been given with others."

God's grace is a wonderful gift for us all, and it is to be shared with others. 2 Peter 1:2 says "May you have more and more grace and peace through the knowledge of God and Jesus our Lord." That is my prayer for each of us – that we may have more and more grace and peace. Ephesians 2:8 says "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God." So, let us accept the gift of God's saving grace and share it with all those we meet.

I hope to see you in worship, in various meetings and times of fellowship and service. Read this newsletter to learn more about the activities of the church in the month of October. While worship is a central gathering purpose for the church, we are also called together in many ways throughout our days. *Come and see!*

PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS SPECIAL OFFERING



As we approach World Communion Sunday (October 1st) we are finalizing our collection of contributions for this Special Offering. The most frequent answers were people who are homeless, immigrant and asylum seekers, and victims of domestic violence. GIRLS 4 GIRLS GHANA

Just what is G4G Ghana, you may be asking? It is an exciting program that the CPJ Committee at FPC has chosen to support. It is a vital non-for-profit organization that provides outreach

services to underserved young women of Ghana. Led by Dina Amoo, a born native of Ghana, they are reaching out to young girls to provide feminine hygiene products and the knowledge of how to use them. Many girls often miss school part of each month because sanitary products are not affordable. On average, girls in Ghana stay in school for 4 years. Through this program, the girls are provided with necessary re-usable supplies to allow them to stay in school. G4G will travel overseas once each year to distribute the supplies personally.

We are going to help by having an open sewing night for making supplies on **Saturday, October 28th** from Noon to 3p.m. All are welcome! You don't need to have sewing skills: lots of help is needed for cutting out fabric and assembling. If you would like to bring a sewing machine, you are very welcome to do so. Plans are in place for developing the 2024 budget. Session members will be receiving budget packages for their committees early in October with a target completion date of November 1. This will give Finance time to consolidate the figures and present a first draft budget to session at its November meeting.

Finance will be directly managing the fall stewardship campaign. We will be providing material for the newsletter, Midweek Update and a direct mailing. Stewardship Sunday will be November 12.

Building and Grounds completed the parking lot resealing and restriping project. The work looks great and will extend the life of our parking lot. Thanks, B&G for completing the work before the snow starts to fly!

Staff Management is working with Worship Coordinator Christy Johanson to revise our organist job description. The current posted job description overstates the actual amount of work we expect an organist to do, and we think that may have discouraged applications. We hope to have the new job description posted soon.

STEWARDSHIP

The vitality of FPCW comes from your passion for the Matthew 25 movement and passion to be actively engaged with those in need, whether it be local or around the world. Thank you all for contributing your talents, time and offerings.

It is almost a new year and as you can see from the financial report above that there is a gap between what was pledged and what has been received..
