Christmas-time is Here

Joy to the World! It is the month of much joy as we prepare for the coming King! We've decked the halls and set up our Giving Tree. This Sunday, the First Sunday of Advent, we will decorate our Chrismon tree with those symbols of our faith. I greatly look forward to this service each year! The word Chrismon is a combination of Christ and monogram. This service is a time when we come together to learn about ancient representations of Christ's life and ministry as we decorate the Chrismon tree. Stick around afterwards for brunch. I hope to see you there!

On the Second Sunday of Advent (December 10), our Great Hall will resound with music, as our intergenerational choir, our children's choir, guest musicians from *Winds Off the Lake*, and pianist Danik Kooistra will bring our Christmas Cantata. Everyone has been working very hard to prepare for this special service, and we can't wait!

On the Third Sunday of Advent (December 17), we'll hear about John, Jesus' cousin, as he reminds us that we need some preparation to do for Jesus' coming.

On December 24th, we'll have two worship services. In the morning, we'll have our service for the Fourth Sunday of Advent, where we'll hear the angel Gabriel announce to Mary that she will be the mother of the Messiah. Then, we'll gather at 5 pm for our traditional Christmas Eve service, complete with candles and singing "Silent Night."

As we gather for worship each Sunday, we'll light more and more Advent candles and prepare for the coming of Jesus, the light that "shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." (John 1:5) As our Advent candles remind us, this is the season of Hope, Peace, Love, and Joy -- so let's share those with everyone we meet!

Also, while we sing about this being "the most wonderful time of the year," we know that's not necessarily the case for everyone. On Thursday, December 21st at 7 pm, we'll have a "Longest Night Service" for those of us who are experiencing some amount of grief or sadness during this season. This quiet, reflective service is for all who struggle during the holidays. We'll hold space for each other, just as we are, knowing that God is present with us in our joy *and* in our sorrow.

I pray you all have a meaningful Advent and Christmas this year, and I look forward to preparing and celebrating with you!

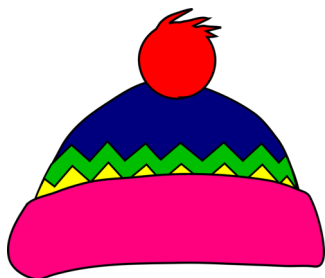
WACM

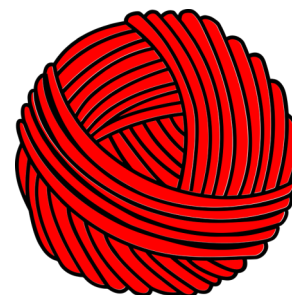

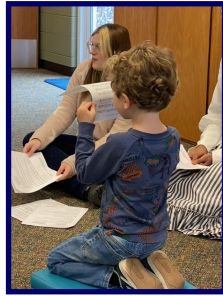

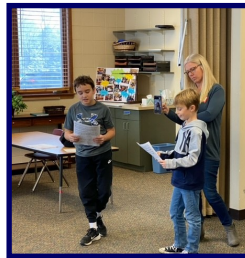

The surplus shown is artificial in that we continue to pull in undesignated McCullough funds based on the schedule we laid out in the 2023 budget. That surplus will shrink thru the remainder of the year.

Session members reviewed the first draft of 2024 budget at the November 19 meeting. Finance will be meeting to review all feedback received and prepare Draft Two for session review and approval at its December 12 meeting. We have another deficit that we will have to cover with McCullough funding or expense reductions.

NOVEMBER SESSION NOTES:

Clerk's Report: The clerk reported that FPCW's minutes were approved by the Presbytery at the November 18, 2023 minute reading at Third Rockford. The clerk requested session members begin planning for attending the 2024 Presbytery Assembly meetings scheduled for February 6, May 14, September 17 and November 19.

Deacons' Report: The Mazurs have sold their home and will be moving to Kansas City.

Nominating Committee: A verbal report was received. Chris Dahm has agreed to join the session, Addison Sobczak will serve another term as youth elder, Kristen Matter and Barb Parish have agreed to be deacons, and Candee McMahon, Mary Hill and Bob Clark have agreed to serve as at large members of the Nominating Committee.

Committee Reports:

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The team is discussing options for what to do with the trailer. Finance will investigate liability insurance coverage for volunteers and the costs of licensing.

Education and Spiritual Growth: Planning for the December youth bake sale is complete.

Ministry Support – Building and Grounds: Matt Thuma is replacing the emergency light batteries as required by the fire inspection.

Ministry Support – Finance: Mark reviewed the first draft of the 2024 budget. Session approved a Finance recommendation to fund the parking lot resurfacing with \$2,694.51 from the Capital Operating account, and \$6,605.49 from the Stained Glass fund.

Worship, Music and Arts: Session approved proposed 2024 communion dates: January 7, February 4, March 3, March 28, April 7, May 5, June 2, July 7, August 4, September 1, October 6, November 3 and December 1.
