Ash Wednesday \rightarrow Lent \rightarrow Holy Week \rightarrow Easter

We began our Lenten journey this year on Valentine's Day, (or vaLENTine's day, as some have written it!), and we now continue our journey toward the cross, and beyond – to the glory of Easter morning.

The season of Lent, despite its somber connotations, is ultimately a season of hope. As we participate in acts of service, engage in prayer and reflection, and allow ourselves to be renewed by the Holy Spirit, we pave the way for the joy of Easter.

Easter Sunday is a celebration of life, victory, and redemption. It is a day we remember Jesus' resurrection from the dead, conquering sin and death, and offering us the promise of eternal life. This promise fills us with immense hope, reminding us that even in the face of darkness and despair, God's light ultimately prevails.

Throughout Lent, let us hold onto this hope. Let us use this time to strengthen our faith, deepen our connection with God, and prepare our hearts to receive the joy and blessings of Easter.

Before we get to the excitement of Easter, though, we go through the tremendous ups and downs of Holy Week. We start Holy Week with Palm Sunday (sometimes called the Triumphal Entry) when we celebrate how Jesus came into the holy city of Jerusalem. The week turns dark, however, and we walk the slow road with Jesus towards his death on a cross. We'll gather on Maundy Thursday for a service of communion, followed by selfguided prayer and meditation stations. On Good Friday, we come together for a service of shadows, or Tenebrae. (*Tenebrae is a Latin word meaning "darkness."*) The services in between Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday are meaningful ones, and I hope to see you here for them, as we ponder the depth of Jesus' sacrifice.

This month brings many activities in the life of the church, which you can read about in the pages of this newsletter. As we prepare for the newness of Spring, why not try something new this month? Take a look at the various ministries of the church, and then *Come and see!*





FEBRUARY SESSION NOTES

Pastor Eric welcomed new session member Chris Dahm to our shared ministry.

Clerk's Report: The annual statistical report filing by the clerk was approved. Mark Bundick was elected Clerk of Session for 2024. Mark Bundick was elected Acting Treasurer.

Deacon's Report: Care packages for college aged members will be prepared and mailed. Angie Boe will be the Deacon's representative for the special committee on the structural deficit.

Nominating Committee: The Committee is waiting for a response on the remaining open ruling elder position.

Committee Reports:

Compassion, Peace and Justice: The diaper distribution program grew to 245 families and 12,942 diapers distributed in 2023. The committee has created spreadsheets to help organize and track volunteers as well as update the supplies inventory. The Christmas Craft Sale raised over \$800. The Rummage Sale will be held April 25-27.

Congregational Life: Plans for advertising our services, particularly around Lent and Easter have been finalized.

Education and Spiritual Growth: The Youth Group will work the highway clean up after worship on April 21. A Lenten book discussion is underway.

Worship, Music and Arts: Advent services were well received. The choir will sing on Good Friday and Easter. The committee is reaching out to do more "Minutes for Mission and Ministry". Discussion is underway about how to better utilize the Food Pantry red wagon as part of the offering.
