A letter from Rev. Eric Corbin

May in the Church

During the month of May, each Sunday has a different special emphasis. All are important days to come together to celebrate and worship God together.

May 5th will be Confirmation Sunday, where we will witness our Confirmands' commitment to serving God, and we will commit to continue nurturing them in the faith. We get to be part of a momentous step in the faith journeys of these seven youth, who will affirm the vows made on their behalf at their baptisms. The Confirmands have been gathering faithfully since September to learn more about the triune God, the Church worldwide, the PC(USA), and this congregation. I'm grateful for this time we've shared together, and look forward to how they'll continue their journey of faith.

On May 12th, we'll celebrate the gift of music in worship with a special Music Appreciation Sunday. I'm looking forward to our chancel choir leading us in worship that day, as well as hearing our children's choir and our Ukulele group! That day is also the day commemorated as Mother's Day. We are grateful for all of the women of the church, who have faithfully guided and nurtured us. As a hymn says, "For all the faithful women who served in days of old, to you shall thanks be given; to all, their story told. They served with strength and gladness in tasks your wisdom gave. To you their lives bore witness, proclaimed your power to save." We give thanks to God for the women who have served throughout the history of the church, through today!

May 19th brings Pentecost Sunday, which is 50 days after Easter Sunday. It commemorates the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and other followers of Jesus, as described in the Acts of the Apostles.

Finally, May 26th is Trinity Sunday, a day which is dedicated to reflecting on the mystery of God's triune nature. On this day, we throw away standard math, and affirm that $1+1+1 = 1$. God is 3 in 1. Though existing as three persons, God is ultimately one being, indivisible and eternal.

I hope to see you in the worship, meetings, fellowship, and service of the church.

This month brings many activities in the life of the church, which you can read about in the pages of this newsletter. Take a look at the various ministries of the church, and then Come and see!

I would like to say a heartfelt thanks to everyone. We had a record-breaking sale this year, all because of the great volunteers that donated, sorted, set up, cashiered, put up and

took down signs, brought snacks, hauled items away and those who prayed for our success.

This year's record time was noon to 2:10 p.m. I announced Sunday at the worship service that we broke a record with proceeds of just under \$4000. DIAPER INSECURITY

Families are considered to have diaper insecurity (diaper need) when they cannot afford a supply of diapers adequate for changing at healthy intervals.

According to a 2023 study by the National Diaper Bank Network:

- Diaper need has increased sharply.
- Diaper need forces families to cut back on other essentials.
- Diaper need is associated with stress and worry.
- Diaper need impacts daily life.
- Diaper need intersects with food insecurity.
- Diaper need results in parents missing work and wages because disposable diapers are required at most daycare facilities.

Fortunately, community-based diaper banks and distributions throughout the U.S. work to address diaper need. The diaper distribution at First Presbyterian serves approximately 40 individuals per month and trending upwards, with the goal of making a difference, and relieving some stress for the families we assist. If you are interested in this local outreach project, please consider helping when your schedule allows.

Our March financial report shows the following:

Both our income and expense are tracking closely to budget.

We have two administrative projects underway right now. First, we are working with Boy Scout Troop 159 to integrate their checking account into our balance sheet. Since the troop is operating under our Illinois state non-profit status, we must report on their financial activity.

Secondly, support for our QuickBooks desktop version will be discontinued May 31. While the program will continue to run, if we need assistance from Intuit, they will no longer be supporting this version of QuickBooks. In May, we plan to transition QuickBooks online. We will be assisted by a company specializing in QuickBooks for non-profits, quickbooksmadeeasy.com. This will be a bit of an undertaking for the Finance team, but once complete, it will make it easier for us to access financial data when we need it.

APRIL SESSION NOTES

Committee Reports:

Compassion, Peace and Justice: Rummage sale preparations are well underway. The Pentecost Offering will be promoted in the midweek update and newsletter.

Congregational Life: The committee is getting small gifts for Mother's and Father's Day to be distributed after worship.

Education and Spiritual Growth: VBS will be held jointly with the First United Methodist Church June 24-28. Confirmation Sunday will be May 5.

Ministry Support - Building and Grounds: The committee is working thru a list of minor building repairs and upgrades. Updating all building lighting to LEDs is nearly complete. The committee is working to prepare a list of capital expenditures needed to fully service our building, including new refrigerator, freezer and HVAC units.

Ministry Support - Finance: Income and expenses continue to track to budget. A Boy Scout Troop 159 bank statement was received and will be incorporated into our balance sheet. Discussion continues with our insurance agent on insuring the troop's trailer and its contents. Our QuickBooks desktop software will be migrated to QuickBooks Online in early May.

Worship, Music and Arts: Holy Week and Easter services were well received by the congregation.

BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS

The building and grounds team is working hard to keep our facilities in good order. We are working on a tight budget and many of our projects are time consuming. Thanks to a grant, we replaced all of our fluorescent lights to new LED panels. We still have some adjustments to do but the new fixtures have motion sensors so turning on and off these lights will no longer be necessary. They were also able to upgrade our parking lot lights to more efficient LED heads. These too have motion detection. The parking lot still has the two additional zones that need to be turned on as needed. Our total cost for this project was just \$100! A team of John Moorhouse, Lee Nejd and Matt Thuma took out the diseased evergreen tree next to the playground. This took some effort, but we did not have to pay to have it removed.



There are a variety of other projects on our list. We are trying to prioritize them. Some will have to wait for funding, others are waiting until we have the manpower to do them. If there is a
