PEACE AND GLOBAL WITNESS SPECIAL OFFERING

A gift to the **Peace & Global Witness Offering** enables the church to promote the Peace of Christ by addressing systems of conflict and injustice across the world. Individual congregations are encouraged to utilize up to 25% of this Offering for peacemaking efforts that align with their passion.

Mid-councils retain an additional 25% for ministries of peace and reconciliation. The remaining 50% is used by the <u>Presbyterian Mission Agency</u> to advocate for peace and justice in cultures of violence, including our own, through collaborative projects of education and Christian witness.

The Compassion, Peace. and Justice committee voted to donate 25% of the offering to the <u>YWCA for Northwestern</u> <u>Illinois</u> in honor of their representative who volunteers to provide Spanish language translation at our monthly Diaper Distribution.

Collection dates for this offering will be from 9/8/2024-10/6/2024.

Committee Reports:

Compassion, Peace and Justice: Starting in 2026, the Pentecost Offering will be discontinued. The Peace & Global Witness Offering will transform into the World Communion Offering in 2026. Mission committees will be required to apply for a grant to use a portion of the collection beginning in 2026.

Education and Spiritual Growth: Rally Day and Sunday School will begin September 8th. Since there is plenty of curriculum left from last year, Sunday School will continue with the existing curriculum.

Ministry Support - Finance: Finance will be working to have 2025 budget materials to committees in October with a goal to approve the 2025 budget at the December meeting.

Worship, Music and Arts: New communion trays and a lid have been purchased to replace damaged trays. A new chair was purchased for the sound booth. Planning has begun for hosting the November 19 Blackhawk Presbytery meeting.



This Special Offering of the PC(USA) is the third of four special offerings this year. Starting in 2026r, this offering will be subsumed in the other offerings, reducing the number of Special Offerings to three. We have set a target of \$1500 for the collection this year. Income and expenses continue running favorable variances thus far.

However, after the end of July, this trend reversed, and as planned, we have drawn down undesignated McCullough Endowment distribution funds to support our cash flow needs. We'll continue monitoring our financials as we head into the new church year.

Right now, we don't expect any significant change in our budgeted expense or income.

At the end of September, Finance will start work on the 2025 budget process. Our goal will be to have a final budget approved by Session at the December meeting and to load that budget into QuickBooks. If we're able to do this, it will greatly simplify our year end process.
