A letter from Rev. Eric Corbin

I love Fall weather! In fact, Autumn is one of my four favorite seasons. Seriously, though I do enjoy experiencing the different seasons in this wonderful world God made for us, Fall weather is probably my favorite. A few years ago while enjoying the beginning of the season, I commented about my love of Fall weather. A friend responded with surprise, "When everything turns brown and dies??" Nope, that's not what I'm talking about! I'm talking about the beautiful kaleidoscope of colors – golden yellows, fiery oranges, and crimson reds – which burst forth into a vibrant masterpiece. I'm talking about the crispness of the air and the gentle rustling of leaves underfoot. I'm talking about evening walks with stunning sunsets, while the creation prepares to rest, but first puts on a display of breathtaking, quiet beauty.

Autumn is also a season when we can reflect on our own transformation. As the trees shed their leaves, we are invited to consider which old beliefs, harmful habits, or limiting perspectives may be hindering our spiritual growth, and shed them, as well. As we observe the trees preparing for winter, we're reminded that transformation is often about preparation — making space for the new growth to come. We are always transforming. While my friend teasingly focused on the aspect of death, autumn also symbolizes renewal and hope. The falling of the leaves and the dormancy of nature pave the way for new growth in the spring. This cycle of death and rebirth inherent in God's creation reminds us that through Christ, we are continually being made new. Paul writes "if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; look, new things have come into being!" (2 Cor 5:17, NRSV). In this season, may we embrace renewal and hope!

World Communion Sunday is the first Sunday of October each year. On this day, we are particularly called to celebrate our oneness in Christ with all of our siblings around the world. It is also a time to share what we have with those in need, through the annual Peace & Global Witness Offering. Pastor's Report: Eric reviewed his work as chair of the Blackhawk Presbytery Nominating Committee and as a member of the Blackhawk Presbytery Council.

Finance now begins the 3-month process of preparing the 2025 budget. We begin by providing each committee a worksheet with their January thru September expenses, plus their October thru December budget amounts. We ask committees to review the October thru December budgets and make any adjustments. Then they fill out worksheets with their initial 2025 budget requests.

Finance will review the 2025 budgets, discuss any questions with committee chairs, then provide the draft budget to session for their review, adjustment and approval. Yes, it's a lot of work, but it's necessary if we're to make good plans for our church. Please pray for us as we begin this process.
