#### A letter from Rev. Eric Corbin

Dear Friends,

As we step into the season of Lent, we find ourselves walking the road toward Jerusalem alongside Jesus. He journeyed toward the cross with purpose, knowing the trials ahead yet holding fast to hope. As his followers, we are called to walk in his footsteps, trusting that even in seasons of struggle and uncertainty, resurrection is coming.

Lent reminds us that we are people of hope, even when the way forward feels unclear. The days are growing longer, and signs of spring are beginning to appear, even if winter still lingers. Likewise, in our spiritual lives, we may experience seasons of grief or change, but we hold fast to the promise that God is at work, renewing us day by day.

This year, as part of our Lenten journey, we are offering a devotional series titled *Grieving Change and Loss: The Unpredictable, Non-Linear, Faith-Filled Journey Toward Resurrection.* It invites us to reflect on the many kinds of loss we experience—not just in death, but in transitions, disappointments, and the unexpected shifts of life—and to consider how our faith helps us navigate them. Those who wish to participate will read the devotional on their own and gather weekly for discussion. 

#### **FINANCE REPORT**

As typical, due to early pledge donations from members, our January Net Revenue was positive – \$29,725 which was over \$9,000 favorable to the January Budget.

As noted in the Annual Report, the projected annual budget deficit is well over \$100,000. To fund this – per session approval, we have resumed the four percent distribution from the McCullough Endowment Fund and we will take a one-time distribution of \$50,000 from this fund. We had paused the four percent distribution about a year and one-half ago, when the fund's value had declined, due to not needing the cash at that time.

We are pleased to welcome Jim Wormley to the Finance Committee to join Vicki Thuma, Pastor Eric, and me.

We need a new Treasurer for the church. If anyone has any questions or suggestions feel free to contact me so that I can pass the information on to the Nominating Committee.

May God bless you for your support toward the financial well-being of our church.

\$50,000 was approved for transfer from the McCullough Funds Account to the General Fund.

Changes were made to check signers for the checking account

#### •Committee Updates and Actions:

The Deacons are working on a Memorial Guide and considering duties for the new Youth Deacon role.

The Education and Spiritual Growth Committee is planning a Lenten Book Discussion.

The Lenten schedule of services has been finalized and distributed.

#### •General:

Reports from various committees (Pastor; Deacons; Compassion, Peace, & Justice; Congregational Life; Education & Spiritual Growth; Finance; Worship, Music and Arts) were received and approved.



When temperatures fall, utility bills rise and requests for DAP assistance increase. That describes the number of requests for assistance made in February. Experiencing a gas service shut off, a mom and her two young sons were referred to DAP for help through the school's Kindness Closet. DAP was able to make payment toward that bill, and together with help from several other groups, heat was restored to their apartment in a couple days. WACM is grateful for the support of its member churches so financial assistance can be provided to Woodstock residents. Thank you for your support.

There is an opening for a First Presbyterian congregant to serve on the board of WACM. Responsibilities include attending monthly meetings on the second Thursday of the month and helping with special projects during the year. Volunteers with the Direct Assistance Program are always welcome too. You do not have to be a member of WACM to volunteer with DAP.
