A letter from Rev. Eric Corbin

June breezes in on a Pentecost wind—the Spirit's breath stirring tree-tops and our own weary lungs. The school year winds down, gardens burst with color, and long evenings invite us outdoors to notice God's handiwork in fireflies, sunsets, and the laughter of children playing outside. As the Easter season draws to a close and we approach Pentecost on June 8, the Spirit nudges us into a gentler rhythm—one that makes room for both rest and renewal.

One week later, on Sunday, June 15, we will celebrate Trinity Sunday *and* step onto Woodstock's historic Square for PrideFest. This year our congregation will walk (and ride) in the parade, carrying banners and the conviction that Christ's welcome has no asterisks. In our church's past participation, more than one passer-by said, "I didn't know a church would welcome me." Your warm smiles turned those words into tears of relief—and into an invitation to experience love without caveats. I hope you'll sign up to walk, wave, pray, or welcome people at our booth. Every gesture of hospitality becomes a sermon in motion.

Summer itself offers a living lesson in community and Sabbath. In Scripture, Sabbath is never only about ceasing; it is about delighting in God, in one another, and in creation itself. Whether you'll find delight gathered around the fire-pit with our youth on June 8, going on a nature walk on June 21, picking up litter along Route 47 on June 28, or sipping lemonade after worship, I encourage you to practice Sabbath intentionally this season. Ask: *Where is God inviting me to breathe, to notice, to rejoice, to serve?*

Meanwhile, Session is launching a **Future of the Church** Task Force to explore creative, sustainable ways to strengthen our ministry and finances. Snacks are promised. If you feel a tug to dream with us, let me know.





FINANCE REPORT FOR JUNE 2025 NEWSLETTER

Net operating revenue is favorable \sim \$22,000 and favorable to budget by \sim \$29,000. Contributions to the Operating Budget are favorable year-to-date by \sim \$17,000 - Thank You for your continued generosity.

The Finance Team met with an outside consultant to review our procedures and policies. The review was positive overall, but we will be revising some of these as suggested. Included in the revisions, the Treasurer's Job Description has been revised again in order make it more attractive. THE PENTECOST OFFERING HELPS OUR YOUTH BEGIN LIFE WITH A STRONG START

Each year on Pentecost Sunday, we celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit and the birthday of the church. CARING TOGETHER



WACM's Direct Assistance Program (DAP) never provides cash payments directly to applicants to assist with their financial needs. Applicants might get a voucher for gasoline at Kristensen's Service Center. To purchase shoes or boots, Woodstock's Blain's Farm and Fleet accepts a DAP voucher, and both Woodstock's Sparrow's Nest and McHenry's Salvation Army Thrift Shop take vouchers for clothing needs. We are grateful for these local businesses who accept the vouchers and then submit them for reimbursement.

We are also grateful to the member churches and individuals who support WACM so we can help residents with their financial needs. Special "thank you" goes out to co-chairs Joyce Maynard and Linda Hansen and all the other volunteers who helped with the church rummage sale.
