Freedom in Christ

This week brings the annual fireworks display in Emricson Park. Events like this draw communities together. When the first rocket blooms overhead, the whole crowd—people of diverse ages and backgrounds—tilts its gaze skyward. For an instant we stand shoulder-to-shoulder, mouths open in wonder, dazzled by light that outshines our differences. This celebration of freedom can remind us of Paul's words: "Christ has set us free to live a free life...use your freedom to serve one another in love; that's how freedom grows." (Galatians 5:1, 13, The Message).

True freedom is never license to live only for ourselves. It is the Spirit-given capacity to love boldly, to bear another's burden, to work for the good of all. As July unfolds, here are some simple, practical ways to put that freedom to work:


