

Expenses were unfavorable to Budget in July by ~\$10,000 and YTD by ~\$17,000 resulting in Net Revenue unfavorable to budget in July by ~\$5,000 and YTD by ~\$17,000. Contributing to the unfavorable expenses were due to unbudgeted HVAC replacement earlier in 2025 of ~\$17,000.
