### A letter from Pastor Eric

October brings the beauty of changing seasons. The trees turn brilliant shades of red and gold, the air grows cooler, and we are reminded that life itself is full of seasons—times of growth, times of letting go, and times of preparing for what comes next. Through every change, God's faithfulness endures.

On the first Sunday of October each year, we join with Christians around the globe in celebrating World Communion Sunday. What a gift it is to remember that our congregation is part of the vast, diverse body of Christ. As bread is broken and the cup is shared in countless places and traditions all around the world, we glimpse the unity of God's kingdom—a love stronger than borders and deeper than differences.

This fall, we have been gathering for our Living Faithfully, Leaving Faithfully series on end-of-life planning. We began by reflecting on how to plan for memorial services, then moved into medical choices and advance directives, and most recently discussed financial and legal matters. Handouts from these sessions are available if you missed them. Our final gathering on October 8 will focus on caring for loved ones with compassion, including grief support groups and walking with one another through loss. These conversations are tender but also deeply hopeful, reminding us that in life and in death we belong to God.

October also brings a change in our church office. You'll see elsewhere in this newsletter (pg. 6) a note about Jeri Loiselle's transition. I hope you'll join me in giving thanks for her faithful service and in surrounding her with prayer as she steps into this next season.

As you look through this newsletter, I invite you to take note of opportunities to connect—whether through fellowship meals and studies, music and knitting, youth and children's ministries, or acts of service such as volunteering, caring for neighbors, or offering hospitality. Each of these is a way of living our faith together in this season.

I am grateful for the many ways you embody Christ's love in worship, fellowship, and service. If you'd like to connect personally, I generally keep office hours on **Tuesdays and Thursdays**, 10:00-2:00, and Wednesdays and Fridays, 2:00-5:00. These hours are tentative—I'm sometimes called away for visits or meetings—but I'm always glad to set another time. An additional 25% is used for ministries of peace and reconciliation by the Mid-councils, while the remaining 50% supports the work for peace and reconciliation being done by Presbyterians across the globe.

#### MONTHLY DIAPER DISTRIBUTION AT FIRST PRESBYTERIAN

As you may know, our church partners with the Woodstock Food Pantry and Keeping Families Covered in McHenry, to coordinate a monthly diaper distribution for eligible children and adults who live in McHenry County. We have a good supply of children's diapers, but are running low on adult incontinence briefs, particularly size medium and extra-large. The partnership agreement with our supplier in 2025 includes children's and toddler diapers, but not adult products. If interested, you can support this local outreach project by donating adult pull-on briefs in size medium or extra-large (we have found that our adult clients prefer the pull-on briefs, rather than products with tab closures).

There will be a designated collection box for adult briefs in the church entryway, near the coat racks. Your support is appreciated, whether you are donating diapers, helping at the distribution, or praying for our clients and volunteers. Thank you!

### Finance Report for October 2025 Newsletter

Revenue was unfavorable to the Budget in August by  $\sim$  \$1,000, and favorable YTD by  $\sim$  \$47,000.

Contributions were unfavorable to the Budget in August by ~ \$1,000, and favorable to the Budget YTD by ~\$22,000. Thank you for your continued generosity.

Expenses were unfavorable to the Budget in August by  $\sim$  \$2,000, and unfavorable to the Budget YTD by  $\sim$  \$15,000. Contributing to the unfavorable expenses YTD was due to the unbudgeted HVAC replacement earlier in 2025 of

 $^{\sim}$  \$17,000. Net Revenue was unfavorable to the Budget in August by  $^{\sim}$  \$2,000 and favorable to the Budget YTD by  $^{\sim}$  \$33,000.
